Tenets of Islam

- 1. Worship only God Almighty (Allah in Arabic) who is our Creator, Sustainer, Protector and to Him is our return.
- 2. Worship Him without any partners or associates because He has none.
- 3. He is Unique, free from all creature qualities and does not resemble anything or anyone in Creation.
- 4. He is the Most Merciful and Most Forgiving and will forgive all sins that you repent for.
- 5. That He is accessible to all His creatures (and all people) who can and should obey Him and seek His forgiveness without any intermediaries.
- 6. We believe in the angels who are also creatures of Allah[®] and perform various functions and duties. Allah[®] mentioned some: Jibreel (Gabriel), Mikaeel (Michael), Israfeel, Malakul Mawth (Angel of Death) and others.
- 7. He sent his messengers and prophets through time starting with the first Adam (Peace be on him) to the last of them, Mohammed (Peace be on him). The list includes all the Biblical prophets, including Noah, Abraham, Moses, and Jesus (Peace be on them all). We believe that all prophets were rightly guided and were free from sin and protected from it by Allah.
- 8. We believe in the Divine Books which include the Scrolls of Abraham, the Torah (to Moses), Psalms of David, Injeel (to Jesus) and the Qur'an to Mohammed (Peace be on them all). Each book was revealed to the prophet in his language which was the language of his people.
- 9. With respect to Jesus (Peace be on him) we believe in the Virgin Mary (Mother of Jesus), the Immaculate Conception, that Jesus spoke in the cradle, his miracles, that he was saved from crucifixion and raised up to Allah, that he will return and fight the Dajjal (antichrist) and establish the religion of God Almighty on earth. He will die a natural death and be buried.
- 10. We believe in Resurrection, the accounting, reward (Jannah Paradise) and punishment (Jahannam Hell).

Are you a South Hadley resident interested in our town's history?



Joachim Neander, 1680 Transl. Madeleine Forell Marshall, 1993



Joachim Neander was a dedicated, caring pastor of the Reformed Church in Düsseldorf, Germany. This was the most familiar of his fifty-six hymn texts, which were published along with many of his original tunes in 1680, the year of his death. Tune: LOBE DEN HERREN 14.14.4.7.8. Henry van Dyke was a noted church leader, U.S. ambassador, Navy chaplain, and prolific writer. Many people associate this hymn with Beethoven's ninth symphony, but few are aware of the original poem by the German classicist F. Schiller (1759–1805) that inspired Beethoven.
